chickens out of paper plates. Together they helped Pat McLaurin paint a log cabin, using the impression of the finger to form the logs. It will be displayed in the museum. They also learned print making, and did a collage project. Their creativity and enthusiasm came through with each project.



Camp wrapped up with a surprise guest. Dot Shirer, one of the original museum board members and member of the Lake Marion Piecemakers Quilt Guild shared with the campers her hand-quilted miniature quilts. The campers enjoyed the stories about the quilts and learned that the Log Cabin quilt pattern had been selected, by proclamation, to be the official quilt for the Town of Elloree.
