# History Lecture by Major General William H. Brandenburg, US Army retired

Tuesday, December 4, 2018, 7:00 pm

On December 24, 1944, during World War II, nearly 300 American soldiers made their way into a mammoth cave in Maastricht, The Netherlands. It was called De Schark cave and was the site of a Christmas Eve midnight Mass organized by local monks. The troops enjoyed a few moments of fellowship, reflection and prayer. They warmed themselves with hot cocoa and coffee and ate doughnuts. A few days later they headed into the raging Battle of the Bulge.

General Brandenburg will share the story of this place in time and of the brave soldiers and the citizens of Maastricht. The US Army and the people of Maastricht still maintain a bond of respect and gratitude. They continue to hold a joint Christmas Eve Mass in the cave as a memorial to these valiant Americans.



William Holman Brandenburg is a retired Major General in the United States Army. A native of Elloree, SC, he graduated from the Citadel where he received a commission in the Infantry. Major General Brandenburg holds a Master's Degree in Management from Troy State University.




The group stayed focused all evening long.


